




# Thunderbirds of Southwest Obio

# Nancy and Julie's T-Bird Story

# A BIG BIRD NESTS IN KETTERING By John Bruning

People were always asking Nancy Blake what year her vintage Thunderbird was. So, she got custom tags that answered the question before it could be asked.

The tags—"LV MY 66"—also announce the affection she, husband Charles and daughter, Julie, have for their flawless, totally original 1966 Ford Thunderbird Town Hardtop.



Charles Blake long regarded the '66 T-Bird as his favorite make and model of vehicle and wanted to own one if the opportunity presented itself. One day in 1990 the Blakes were driving near Springfield, passed a used-car lot, and, "there it was," Nancy Blake recalled.

The car called to them, and they responded. It embodied everything they wanted in their first and only collectible vehicle. And despite its age at the time, the car was all-original, with fewer than 40,000 miles on the odometer, and looked like it just came from a new-car showroom.

That's where a "little old lady from Pasadena" comes in. As in the '60s pop song, the car's first owner actually was an elderly woman (presumed to be diminutive in stature) in Pasadena, Calif. And she chose her luxurious, options-loaded car well and took meticulous care of it. So did the second owner, so that the Blakes were eventually able to discover it perched magnificently in the car lot.

Charles Blake found the ideal hobby car for his family, and his wife and daughter became active members of the Heartland of Ohio Vintage Thunderbird Club of America. Nancy and Julie have taken the car to many cruise-ins and shows, with Charles joining in for major events. The family's home in Kettering is filled with trophies and awards.

But the Blakes' totally original big bird is really in a class of its own. T-Bird emblems spread their wings, respectively, in front, in the perfect, wide expanse of checkerboard grille, and, in back, in the midst of wide taillights with sequential turn signals. And the car's molded lines create a strong, distinctive look.

The original paint, a light metallic blue called Silver Mink, and the chrome accents gleam. "People either love the color or hate it," Nancy said.

The interior is luxurious, flawless and includes a curved rear seat. There is a powerful 428 engine, factory air and power windows and doors. Dave Hyder of Fairborn services the car.

The Blakes stay busy in the local and national T-bird clubs, and Nancy has served as treasurer of the local club since 1996. For that, and other volunteer services, she recently received the national club's top annual award, the Kimrey Award.

The family operates a home-based business, Blake Heating Service and Repair. There are three other adult daughters: Debbie Brooks and Sharon Henderson, both of Bellbrook; and Karen Blake, of Florida.
